Under the SDW cell of AS & H, We have planned various activities for the overall development of first year B.Tech students. These activities are conducted as per department and college schedule. We are submitting the report of the activities conducted in the academic year 2024-25 Sem-I and II.

1. Admission:

Admission Process for First Year Engineering of A.Y. 2024-25 started from 10th June 2025 till 11th September 2025. As per DTE rules it was smoothly carried out for 1154 admissions for FYB Tech. Re-admission was done on 10th October 2024.

2. Induction Program & Parent Meet:

The Department of Applied Sciences and Humanities organized "Induction Program and Parent Meet" for newly admitted first year B. Tech. students of Academic year 2024-25 on 09th September 2024 at Ramkrishna More Natyagruha Chinchwad.

The program was organized with an objective to make the students and parents familiar with the policies, culture of the institute and to answer queries related to the academics, examinations, hostel, mess, etc.

Around 2100 people including parents & Students were present for the induction programme and parent meet.









3. FESA:

For formation of **First Year Students Association (FESA)**, the process of selection for **FESA** under **SDW** carried out with 3 rounds. 1st round of selection was done under class teachers observations and students interest. For 2nd round SDW Coordinators along with team SDW selected 70 students. Along with Academic coordinators and SDW coordinators team of 24 students was shortlisted for the final round by HoD.
